To all the parents and family members we were able to meet during the week's events, thanks for coming up and introducing yourselves and sharing kind words. Your support and well wishes make volunteering in this position a little brighter! Shelby and I also had the honor of meeting the Ship's Sponsor, Darleen Greenert (pictured), the Secretary of the Navy, Carlos Del Toro, and Senator Richard Blumenthal, and we shared some of our stories from our time as your Ombudsmen and the sacrifices the families of our service members must endure. #### OMBUDSMAN UPDATE CONT'D

As always, we want to add a reminder about Operations Security (OPSEC). One of the most important jobs of a military family is to keep the information your sailor gives you safe. This information could be about boat movement, port calls, the maintenance schedule, or upcoming missions. Keeping the information safe includes not sharing it in writing, in public places, or in virtual spaces like on Facebook. If you are on our Facebook group, you may have seen the example I posted of 3 spam accounts trying to access our public fan page this month. The spam accounts had all stolen photos of sailors and were pretending to be supporting our boat. We have passed those fake profiles on to NCIS, but it is a reminder that we must be constantly vigilant. If families begin to share information in unsafe ways, it could put our sailors and the boat at risk. "Loose lips sink ships" is an old adage, but it is still completely applicable. Please do your part in keeping our loved ones safe and able to come home to us!

























## Family Readiness Group
